### **Extension activity ideas...**

Can you construct a bar graph to show how many trees of each type you discovered?

Can you design a key to recognise spring flowers?

Did you see any birds while you were out walking? Can you find a key to identifying them? What kind of birds were seen most?

How many steps did you walk (if you can count them on a tracker or phone) and how many more would you have walked if you'd have taken one of the other paths in the woods or park?

Design a poster to inform people about how many different kinds of trees there are in the Park or Wood.

Write a leaflet to advertise walking in the local environment as way of staying fit with your family.

Design some exercises to do at certain points of your favourite walk – explain to your reader what they might be able to see as they complete their star jumps (plants, animals, views)
