A trip to the Science Museum

This term, Year 3 visited the Science Museum to learn more about forces, which links with their Science Topic. The children visited the Wonderlab, with over 50 mind-blowing science experiments. The experiments are spread across 7 different zones and give children the opportunity to have hands on experiences. The children had the chance to play with forces on the friction slide and pulley seats, see lightning flash before their eyes and travel through space. They also got the chance to watch a science show called 'Feel the Force!' where the children witnessed and learned more about forces.

The children thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

Reception

This term, the Reception topic has been 'Me, Myself and I'. The children made some amazing family trees that they brought in from home and shared with the rest of the children in their class, telling them all about the different members of their families. Thank you parents and carers for all of your hard work with the family trees. We have also been learning about Chinese New Year. We made some beautiful lanterns and even tasted some delicious Chinese food such as rice, noodles and prawn crackers - they went down a treat! The Reception children have learnt about the body, including various body parts and why it is important to keep healthy. The children participated in some exercise, observing the effects it had on their bodies and enjoyed some fruit tasting, discussing their likes and dislikes.



Year 5 visit Sutton House

As part of their Heroes and Villains topic, Year 5 visited Sutton House, an exquisite Tudor house in Hackney. It is one of London's last remaining Tudor houses, built in 1535 by Sir Ralph Sadleir (the Secretary of State to Henry VIII in 1540). Sutton House was his family home. The children were able to experience the atmosphere of a Tudor house as they explored the Great Hall, a fine oak-panelled chamber and a small kitchen. They were taken on a journey back to 1535 to explore the Tudor period through costume, role-play and object handling. They discovered how life was for a rich and poor Tudor living and working at Sutton House. They gained an understanding of how important 'status' was in Tudor times and were able to identify it by looking at functionality verses decretive. The children really enjoyed their visit to Sutton House and learned a lot about the Tudors.

Year 6 Science: Filtration Experiment

This half term Year 6 have been learning about "The Water Cycle" and the importance of having clean drinking water. With this in mind, the children were set a challenge - by their teachers in science class - to produce clean water from a sample of

water, which had been contaminated with soil, twigs and small stones. As a result, they had to design and build a filter using a range of materials: hessian, crepe paper, tissue paper, cotton wool, nets, filter paper, funnels and plastic bags. The children had to ascertain which materials would be useful and which were red herrings! Once the filter was built, they poured the water through their filter and waited to see which group had produced the cleanest water.

It's All About Sound and Music for Year 4

This term, Year 4 have been learning all about Sound and Music. In Science, they have learned how sound is made, explored pitch and conducted investigations on how sound travels. To consolidate their learning, the pupils have learned from the world-renowned musicians, ranging from a Gamelan workshop with Byron to Jazz workshops with Orphy and learned about music composition with Kay. In computing, they

have composed their own beat using Garageband, 2Beat and 2Squence on PurpleMash. In Literacy, they have also written their own versions of the class text, 'The Bear and The Piano'. During PE, they have also learned several choreographed dance sequences.





Wiggly Wild Show

Year 2 have been busy learning all about different habitats and animal adaptation this term. They were delighted to receive a visit from the Wiggly Wild Show (a specialist Rainforest Workshop involving a variety of live animals). Children were able to experience and handle, first-hand, creatures such as; a scorpion, a giant millipede, stick insects, a giant African land snail, and a leech. The children were also given the opportunity to ask questions and learn about what it is like to explore a real-life rainforest.

Swimming Gala

On Monday 20th January some Year 5 children took part in the Greenwich School Sport Partnership Winter Swimming Gala. We were able to take two teams along to Shooters Hill College to compete in various races against other local schools. The children used all of the skill and confidence they have gained in their weekly lessons to perform brilliantly. The 'boat race' was by far the most popular. The children had great fun pulling their team mates along in an inflatable dingy! Well done to all of the children who took part.

Boxtrolls in Year 1

This term Year 1 have created lots of amazing work on Boxtrolls. They have created their own Boxtrolls, written descriptive pieces on their Boxtrolls appearance and what they like to eat and collect. They have also written short stories about their Boxtrolls and the adventures that they have been on.

Children under 10 years old must be accompanied by a parent or guardian to the youth clubs and children under 6 years old must be accompanied by a parent or guardian to the adventure playgrounds.

Activity to do at home: Butterfly Cakes

110g butter

110g caster sugar

2 eggs

1 tsp vanilla extract

110g self-raising flour

½ tsp baking powder

1 tbsp milk

plus 2 tbsp if needed, to loosen the buttercream strawberry jam (optional) sprinkles (optional)

For the buttercream

300g icing sugar 150g butter

2 tsp vanilla paste



Method:

- 1. Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Line a cupcake tin with 10 cases. To make the sponge, tip the butter, sugar, eggs, vanilla, flour, baking powder and milk into a large mixing bowl and beat with either a hand whisk or electric mixer until smooth, pale and combined. Divide the batter between the cases and bake for 15 mins until golden brown and a skewer inserted in the middle of a cake comes out clean. Leave on a wire rack to cool.
- 2. While the cakes are cooling, make the buttercream by beating together the icing sugar, butter and vanilla until pale and fluffy. Mix in the extra milk if the icing feels too stiff.
- 3. Once the cakes are cool, use a sharp knife to slice off the tops, then cut the tops in half. Pipe or spread the buttercream on top of the cakes, then gently push two semi-circular halves into the buttercream on each cake, doing this at an angle to look like butterfly wings. You can serve the cupcakes at this stage, or decorate them with a little blob of jam in the centre and a scattering of sprinkles, if you like.
