Year 3 Roman Day!



Year 6 reading with Reception

This term, children at the top of the school have volunteered their time to read with the very youngest! Three times a week, for twenty minutes, year 6 join their reading buddy in Reception to share favourite stories. Books are chosen by the younger child, but read by the older one, using all the experience and skills they have gained since they were five themselves.

It is hoped that all the children taking part gain from this collaborative project – a new 'sibling' to learn from, or ask questions. Some of the year 6 taking part remember being read to when they were in Reception! An amazing full 'circle of reading' at Plumcroft.

What's that you hear?

This term, Year 4 have been learning about sound. They have been exploring vibrations, sounds across the school and how sound is created. They understand

about different pitches and how sound travels through the ear to enable us to hear. They have taken part in different experiments such as, a 'sound walk' through the school and listening to how sounds change according to distance. Year 4 have used these skills to create their own instruments.

Year 5 have been reading Macbeth as part of our Literacy and Topic work. The children had a very exciting day in which they investigated a crime scene in their classrooms. There was police tape, an outline of a body and some suspicious items at the scene! Using their best detective CSI work, they deduced that King Duncan had been murdered! Then they decided who the suspects were and conducted a police interview to question them! The children really enjoyed reading Macbeth and taking part in a Macbeth drama workshop.



The Highway Rat

This half term Year 2 have been busy reading Julia
Donaldson's 'The Highway Rat'.
They have produced some lovely work based on the text, including character descriptions, drama through role play and even some eye-catching wanted posters!

The children also enjoyed creating their own characters to add into the story. With any luck, that pesky rat will be tracked down soon!

North and South Pole Magnets

In Science this half term, Year 3 have been learning all about magnets.

They have been busy carrying out lots of experiments such as, seeing how strong different magnets are and exploring materials to see if they are magnetic or not. Did you know that if you put a bar magnet under a sheet of paper and sprinkle iron powder lightly over the top, you will suddenly see the invisible magnetic field as the particles stick to it?





Rockets and Spaceships

In Year 1, the children have been getting creative and have made junk model spaceships and rockets. The children watched some examples of rockets launching into space to help inspire their own designs. They used materials such as bottles, cardboard and lids to make the models. After, they used tissue and glue to papier-mache the rockets, so that they could paint them.

The children are hoping that the brightly coloured rockets will be spotted from space!



Rainforests

Year 2 have been exploring Rainforests, which links to their Literacy and Topic lessons. The children have been reading the core text "Roaming through the Rainforest', which is an exciting rhyming story that takes them on a journey through the luscious colourful rainforest. Along the way the children met lots of beautiful animals and creatures.



New Nursery Class at Vincent Road

It has been a very exciting half term opening the new Nursery Class at Vincent Road. All the children have now settled in really well and seem to be happy. The children had a great time learning all about 'Chinese New Year!'. From all of us in Nursery 'Kung Hei Fat Choi'.
